NAB 3 HUNTERS  
WITH 86 DUCKS

Three men charged with violating regulations issued under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act were arrested, and 86 ducks, 3 guns, 3 hunting coats, a leather jacket, and 2 hunting licenses bearing Federal duck stamps were seized by two deputy U. S. game-management agents on the Susquehanna Flats, near Havre de Grace, Md., Thursday night (Nov. 15), according to the Bureau of Biological Survey. Two of the men gave their home address as Aberdeen, Md., and the other Bel Air, Md.

The arrests were made by Agents J.S.C. Boswell and C.W. Wallace, both working out of the Washington office. In the bags of the three hunters, they report, were 45 scaups, 39 canvasbacks, and 2 redheads. The daily bag limit for each hunter of these ducks is 5 of any one or 5 of all and the possession limit is 2 days' bag.

The 1934-35 hunting season on ducks opened in Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Tennessee, and Alabama on November 8 and will close January 12. During this period shooting is allowed on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays only.
