DIRECTORY SHOWS ORGANIZED INTEREST IN WILDLIFE WORK

Forty-three national organizations in the United States are concerned with wildlife protection, says the U. S. Biological Survey. Organizations in Canada, within the various States, and in Alaska raise the total for North America to 181, not including Federal and State, Dominion, and Provincial governmental agencies.

A directory recently compiled by Frank G. Grimes, of the Biological Survey, lists both the private and governmental agencies, their officers, and addresses. The directory has been issued by the U. S. Department of Agriculture as Miscellaneous Publication 329, "Officials and Organizations Concerned with Wildlife Protection, 1938."
