Dates for hearings on the Alaska fishery regulations to be effective in 1942 have been approved as follows, according to the Fish and Wildlife Service, United States Department of the Interior:

Ketchikan, September 10; Wrangell, September 12; Sitka, September 15; Juneau, September 18; Anchorage, September 24; Cordova, September 27; Kodiak, September 30; and Seattle, October 20.

Hearings at all the places mentioned above will be conducted by the Director of the Service, Dr. Ira N. Gabrielson. Assisting him will be regional representatives of the Service for their various districts and, as currently scheduled, Seton H. Thompson, Assistant Chief, Alaska Division of the Service. Doyle C. Trippe, of the Alaska Division, will again act as reporter for the hearings. Upon his return, he will remain permanently stationed at Seattle in connection with the Alaska fisheries work.
