The appointment of James M. Lemon as Chief of the Technological Section, Division of Fishery Industries, Fish and Wildlife Service was announced today by Dr. Ira W. Gabrielson, Director of the Service.

Mr. Lemon succeeds Roger W. Harrison, who is resigning to accept a position in the vitamin oil industry in Seattle. Mr. Harrison had been a member of the staff of the Fish and Wildlife Service and the former Bureau of Fisheries for 15 years.

Mr. Lemon has been associated with the Service and its predecessor agencies since 1928 when he was employed as an Associate Technologist specializing in refrigeration. In 1930 he was transferred to Gloucester to take charge of the Bureau of Fisheries Technological Research Laboratory at that place. In 1935 the Gloucester laboratory was moved to College Park, Maryland, and has remained under Mr. Lemon's direction. Mr. Lemon, a native of Aixvasse, Missouri, is a graduate of the University of Missouri and received his master's degree at the University of Florida.

Dr. Hugo W. Nilson, who has been with the Service for many years as a pharmacologist, will be in charge at College Park.
