DFA ESTABLISHES FIELD OFFICE IN CHICAGO

The appointment of Joseph J. Glass, of Chicago, Ill., as area representative for the Defense Fisheries Administration in the Great Lakes area was announced today by Secretary of the Interior Oscar L. Chapman.

The new field office will be temporarily located in the Market News Office of the Fish and Wildlife Service at 200 North Jefferson Street in Chicago. Mr. Glass assumed his new duties on March 14.

Mr. Glass will handle local material, production, man power and other problems confronting the fishing industry in the Great Lakes region as a result of the stepped-up defense production operations. He will also serve in a liaison capacity between the fishing industry in that area and the Washington offices of DFA.

A native of Buffalo, N. Y., Mr. Glass has been sales representative for a number of large wholesale fish and seafood producers in Chicago since 1947. Mr. Glass also served with the Bureau of Internal Revenue of the United States Department of the Treasury in Buffalo from 1941 to 1945. In 1946 he was with the War Assets Administration.

Mr. Glass is married and lives at 1033 West Loyola Avenue, Chicago.
