

Two and possibly three of the birds, whose scientific name is Palmeria dolei, but which are better known as the crested honey-creeper, were seen by Eugene Kriedler, administrator of Bureau activities in Hawaii.

The crested honey-creeper is classed as an endangered species by the Department of the Interior. Heretofore the last known sighting of the species was December 5, 1950.

Quarter Million Trout Eggs Shipped to South America

Washington, D. C.: More than 250,000 trout eggs, produced at National Fish Hatcheries, were recently sent to two South American countries according to John S. Gottschalk, Director of the Interior Department's Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife.

Bolivia received 150,000 fertilized brook trout eggs from the Walhalla National Fish Hatchery in South Carolina, and Ecuador received more than 100,000 fertilized rainbow trout eggs produced at the Bowden National Fish Hatchery in West Virginia.

Director Gottschalk said the egg shipments were part of a continuing Bureau program to assist other countries in developing their fish and wildlife resources.
