

by the Bureau of the Census under contract to the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, also will determine how many people hunt and fish, what types of hunting and fishing they prefer, how far they travel in pursuit of these sports, and other statistical information.

The Hunting and Fishing Survey is financed with Federal Aid to Fish and Wildlife Restoration funds. It has the formal endorsement of the International Association of Game, Fish and Conservation Commissioners representing the States.

In several States, hunters and fishermen are required to purchase separate licenses, stamps, permits or tags for taking different kinds of fish or game. For example, a special stamp is required in some States to fish for trout, and hunters in several States must have special permits or tags to hunt such animals as elk, deer, or turkey.

The attached tables provide additional details on hunting and fishing license sales in Fiscal 1965.
