



Scientific cropping of wildlife would have application elsewhere since much of the earth's surface is not suited to production of domestic livestock but can support native game animals, he noted.

The Secretary emphasized the need for migratory bird treaties among nations of Europe, Asia, and Africa patterned after those between the United States, Canada, and Mexico. He also suggested a migratory bird treaty among the nations of the Western Hemisphere, and pointed out that the United States and other countries of North America are in an excellent position to promote such treaties.

"We are confident that the United States can and should enthusiastically support an international conference on the conservation of wildlife under the sponsorship of the United Nations," the Secretary said. He suggested that the conference be called for 1968.
