

through June 1969. Every migratory-waterfowl hunter 16 years of age or older must purchase this \$³/₈ stamp with a State hunting license.

All revenue from duck stamps, except the cost of printing and distribution, is used for acquisition of wetlands for waterfowl. More than 1½ million stamps were sold last year.

Artists from 34 states and the District of Columbia competed in this year's contest. Minnesota had 20 entries from 12 artists. Pennsylvania and New York were second with 14 entries.

Leslie C. Kouba of Minneapolis designed the current stamp which features Old Squaw ducks. Information on other designs since the stamps were first issued in 1934 is contained in "Duck Stamp Data," a publication available for 25 cents from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.
